Imagine rats crawling over your children at night as they sleep, the constant bite of mosquitoes keeping you awake at night or knowing that you have nothing but a bit of flour mixed with dirty water from a nearby stream to feed your children.

Poor families are forced to deal with these horrific conditions every day. They live in tiny shacks that can come crashing down on their children at any moment. They have no relief or safety net, and many cannot afford even basic medicines or the transportation costs to reach the nearest hospital, so illness can quickly become life-threatening.

Food For The Poor (CFC #10328) is committed to serving the poorest of the poor by helping people out of poverty one family at a time. Thanks to our generous donors we are able to feed hundreds of thousands of people every day and provide shelter for families who once lived in dilapidated shacks made of mud and scraps of zinc, wood, plastic and cardboard.

"I no longer have to worry about the rain kicking us out of our own home, and that makes me feel at peace in my house," said Mary, a grateful Haitian mother of three girls who received a new home.



This is one of more than 9,700 homes Food For The Poor has built in Haiti since the 2010 earthquake.

Food For The Poor began in 1982 in Jamaica. Today, our interdenominational Christian ministry serves the poor primarily in 17 countries throughout the Caribbean and Latin America. How to supply *clean* water to a family for 10 years for \$13.50

Komponhg Phluk, a remote village in rural Cambodia, doesn't lack for water. It's on a river that floods regularly, good for growing rice, the village's main food and cash crop. But it's not good for providing drinking water.

Like many rural areas around the world that lack water and sewage treatment systems, Komponhg Phluk's residents struggle with the consequences of not having clean drinking water.

These includes the health consequences, such as diarrhea. Indeed, the United Nations' Human Rights Office estimates that 800 children die from diarrheal diseases each DAY.

There are also economic and environmental consequences: residents often spend hours cutting wood to boil water, time that could be spent working in the rice fields or studying in school.

B ut an amazingly simple and inexpensive water filter is changing people's lives in Komponhg Phluk and in many other parts of the world, in part thanks to the work of Children's Food Fund/World Emergency Relief.

Developed by a ceramics professor at the University of Northern Illinois, the filter is a simple ceramic pot with pores created by adding saw dust or rice husks before firing. This filters out particulates. The clay is impregnated with colloidal silver, which sterilizes the water.

One filter can last a family of four 10 years. It produces a liter of water per hour.

"The beauty of these filters is that there is no technology," explains Gary Becks, a retired firefighter who lives in Cambodia and works with Children's Food Fund (CFC #10984).

"There are no batteries. No diesel fuel. No moving parts. The pots are hard to break."

He says this is a stark contrast to many well-intended projects in less developed parts of the world, which rely on much more complicated devices, such as reverse osmosis filtering systems.

"Often these things collapse in a few weeks from a simple wire connection corroding. It's what we call Jesus junk.' It sits unused."

one. "The problem with a community water system is that you need someone on staff who will maintain it," Becks said.

For Komponhg Phluk, this involved bringing in 400 filters. It takes nearly seven hours to drive to this village from Cambodia's capital, over very primitive roads. *"You feel like you've been in a washing machine."*

But when the group arrives, people are often ecstatic, especially the women, Becks said. *"Women and children do most of the work gathering and cutting wood for the fires to boil water.*

"They realize these filters mean no more diarrhea." In these remote communities, often far from health care, Becks said diarrhea

can be a death sentence. "You can die of dehydration in three days. Clean water is not a convenience.

"People are ecstatic. Their reactions are what makes this work so worthwhile."

"When we go back to a village in six months, we see no more bloated bellies from worms. A health clinic we support reports 90% fewer intestinal problems. People see these filters as a godsend."

What do the CFC's many changes mean for you?

The CFC underwent major changes last year designed to streamline the campaign and make giving easier and more efficient. Here's what these changes mean for you:

- You now have a simple way to make your CFC pledge online. There is one central website that processes your donation: CFCgiving.opm.gov. You can make your pledge now.
- There are fewer charities. Charities must now pay an application fee, which has caused many charities that raised little or nothing through the CFC to drop out.
- You can still choose from hundreds of charities, doing all kinds of charity work. The broad range of charities you can learn about and support through the CFC has long been one of its best features.

- You can search for charities online, in many ways. The simplest way to support a charity in this guide is to input its 5-digit CFC number.
 - You can choose to volunteer through the CFC and have your time count as a contribution.
 - Charities still must meet a series of accountability standards, such as an annual audit (*except for very small charities*).
 - Retirees can now give through the CFC. They can have a little deducted from each annuity payment.
